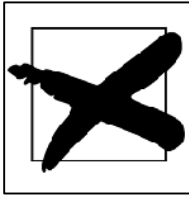
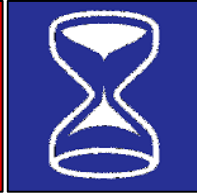
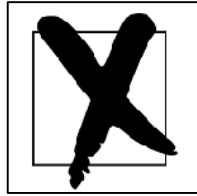
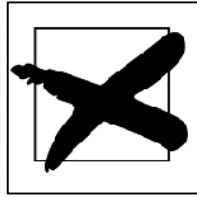
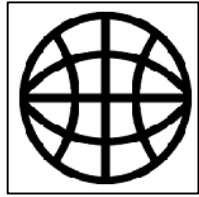


Let's go Dutch!

In this game you will get to know the Dutch
from an intercultural perspective



Game concept:

Form teams of at least two persons. Throw the dice. According to which colour you're on, you select the right side of the card (the orange or the white one). If you have to give the right answer in 30 seconds and it is allowed to look up information on the Internet during this 30 seconds. If you guess right, you may throw the dice another time. This second time, you will not take a card.

There are four categories, each with their own colour. Although you are on a crown (orange) or an hourglass (blue), you can get questions about anything that belongs to that colour, like politics or sports.
